New sustainability 'school'

AUSTRALIAN construction and infrastructure industry leaders have joined forces to create an online school aimed at increasing sustainability knowledge and competency across the supply chain.



In a unique industry collaboration, a number of construction and infrastructure companies are working together to improve industry standards and promote their shared vision of a more sustainable supply chain with the launch of the Supply Chain Sustainability School in Australia.

Leveraging the standout success of a similar model in the UK, the school has launched an online self-assessment tool for businesses, e-learning modules and a resource library—addressing topics such as waste, water, carbon and energy, environmental management and climate adaptation.

The Australia-wide initiative is being launched by eight founding partners – John Holland, Mirvac, Stockland, Downer Tenix, McConnell Dowell, Infrastructure Sustainability Council of Australia, DuluxGroup and Laing O'Rourke – with additional funding and support provided by NSW Government, Sustainability Victoria and Construction Skills Queensland. The School will be delivered by the Net Balance Foundation, with support from Ernst & Young.
